When Less is More

The Therapist's Use of Self with a Narcissistically Vulnerable Adult Patient

Andrea Harris Alpert explores the complexities of working with an adult patient whose early deprivation and subsequent limited functioning in adulthood result in the use of the therapist to fulfill rudimentary selfobject functions. This transference relationship presents countertransference challenges for the therapist in terms of tolerating periods of uncertainty in the treatment and the desire to “do more.” Following a case presentation, Constance Goldberg will lead a discussion of the salient clinical issues that emerged from the clinical material presented.
