Absolute Charter by the New York State Board of Regents

The Westchester Center for the Study of Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy

WCSPP was chartered in 1974 by the Regents of the University of the State of New York to meet the training needs of mental health professionals. WCSPP is interdisciplinary, nonhierarchical, and committed to the collaboration between faculty and candidates in the development of curriculum, policies, and a strong educational milieu. The faculty represents a range of contemporary psychoanalytic perspectives. It is committed to a continuing reassessment of psychoanalysis and psychotherapy in the light of new knowledge and developments in the profession. WCSPP is committed to offering financial assistance to candidates in all training programs.

The *Psychoanalytic Training Program* (four years) is designed to provide candidates with a firm grounding in psychoanalytic theory and practice through courses, supervised psychoanalytic clinical work, and a personal analysis.

The *Adult Psychotherapy Training Program* (two years) provides candidates with advanced training in psychotherapy, through courses and supervised clinical work.

The *Child and Adolescent Psychotherapy Training Program* (two years) provides candidates with advanced training in psychotherapy with children, adolescents, and their families, through courses and supervised clinical work.

The *Couples Psychotherapy Training Program* (one year) provides candidates with advanced training in psychotherapy for couples through courses.

The *Psychoanalytic Supervisory Training Program* (one year) is designed to develop the skills and theoretical background consistent with supervisory responsibilities.

The Treatment Service of WCSPP provides psychoanalysis and psychoanalytically oriented psychotherapy for those in the community interested in obtaining such treatment at low cost.

The Psychoanalytic Training Institute of The New York Freudian Society (PTI of NYFS)

The Psychoanalytic Training Institute of the New York Freudian Society (PTI of NYFS) offers a variety of programs in both New York City and Washington DC for students interested in adult psychoanalysis, child/adolescent psychoanalysis, psychoanalytic psychotherapy, and parent-infant treatment. It is a Component Institute of the International Psychoanalytical Association (IPA). Our programs are informed by post-Freudian developments and theoretical perspectives, as well as by current research on infant development and attachment. We have a modern Freudian curriculum that places analytic listening at the center of the learning process. Seasoned clinician-instructors present detailed clinical material that includes how they as analysts thought and felt as they made choices as to what to address in the hour. Within this rich and complex context, candidates learn to listen to a wide range of clinical material from multiple vantage points and at many levels.

The **Adult Psychoanalysis Program in New York** is registered as licensure qualifying by the New York State Education Department (NYSED). It is offered in two tracks: Track A is for clinicians who have a New York State license in the fields of psychiatry, psychology, social work (LCSW), or nursing (as a nurse practitioner); Track B is for applicants who are interested in a certificate of completion in order to qualify to apply to the NYSED for a License in Psychoanalysis (LP). Applicants for Track B may include clinicians who have an LCAT, LMHC, or LMFT credential, as well as graduates of other master's and doctoral programs who have a strong interest in psychoanalysis. LMSW's may also receive the supervised clinical experience needed for the LCSW credential in this program.

The **Adult Psychoanalysis Program in Washington** is designed to enable candidates who live in other locations, or who have schedules that preclude taking weekly classes, to train in a program that meets from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on twelve Saturdays each academic year. (Please note that this program will not qualify applicants to apply for the LP credential in New York.)

For the clinician interested in **Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy**, we offer a two-year program involving coursework and supervised counseling or therapy in New York. Applicants must hold a license in New York State such as a PhD or LCSW or be a psychiatric nurse clinician, or hold a license that includes conducting psychotherapy in the scope of practice, such as the LCAT.

The **Anni Bergman Parent-Infant Training Program**, designed for the graduate analyst or advanced psychoanalytic candidate, is offered in New York in collaboration with the Institute for Psychoanalytic Training and Research.

NYSPP's three-year program is relevant and oriented to the needs of clinicians who practice in a variety of settings. Classes meet in Manhattan on Monday evenings for two fifteen-week seminars over three years.

NYSPP offers a training program in psychoanalysis for qualified candidates of the New York School of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis and other applicants whose previous clinical experience and studies indicate an interest and readiness to engage in additional training. The course of study is unique in that it recognizes that those who have a solid foundation in the practice of psychoanalytic psychotherapy are excellent candidates for continuing their studies to become psychoanalysts. The NYSPP Psychoanalytic Program is accredited by the Accreditation Council of Psychoanalytic Education (ACPE).

NYSPP maintains Clinical Services on Long Island, in Westchester and New York City, and in New Jersey. An annually published membership directory facilitates networking and referrals.

NYSPP has an active Alumni Association that sponsors major professional meetings open to the public. It also hosts smaller meetings for members and candidates, and special workshops and seminars for ongoing learning.

NYSPP has an absolute charter from the Board of Regents of the State of New York to provide educational training in psychoanalytic Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis.

The Institute for Contemporary Psychotherapy

Four-Year Program in Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy

The Institute for Contemporary Psychotherapy (ICP) was founded in 1971, and was granted a provisional charter by the Regents of the University of the State of New York in September of 1973. The institute received its permanent charter on January 8, 1978, and it is presently incorporated as a nonprofit corporation.

The aims of ICP are to provide training in psychoanalysis and psychoanalytic psychotherapy for qualified professionals and to provide, at moderate cost, the full range of psychotherapeutic services and a research setting in which knowledge of the psychotherapeutic process can be advanced.

It is our philosophy that the development of treatment skill and competence can best be carried out in a setting in which the continued personal growth of the therapist is fostered. The program therefore emphasizes the development of personal awareness, as well as the development of technical skills and theoretical knowledge. Courses are offered from a variety of theoretical and clinical perspectives, including Freud, Sullivan, object relations, dreamwork, self-psychology, relational theory, and development from infancy to older adults.

In addition to our adult treatment division, there are divisions for the treatment of trauma, children and adolescents, family and couples, persons with eating disorders, older adults, artists, groups, and gay and lesbian affirmative psychotherapy. Candidates have the opportunity to work in these divisions and accrue hours towards the requirement for graduation.

Candidates are assigned patients from the Institute's clinical services which provide psychoanalysis and psychoanalytic psychotherapy for a current population of over 600, a third of them seen more than once a week. Professional treatment staff currently number over 150. In addition, there are over 100 supervisors and faculty members. Considerable attention is given to both the development of a treatment plan and to the suitability of the therapist for the particular patient and problem under consideration.

Two-Year Evening Program in Contemporary Psychodynamic Psychotherapy

ICP's Two-Year Program in Contemporary Psychodynamic Psychotherapy is a convenient evening program designed to provide an intensive learning experience combining course work, individual and group supervision, patient contact and individual psychoanalytic psychotherapy.

The program starts in September and consists of two semesters of fifteen weeks each. Classes meet on Tuesday evenings from 6:00 to 9:15 p.m., with participants attending one clinical course, one theoretical course, and one group supervision course. The coursework covers the essential concepts of psychoanalytic psychotherapy with an emphasis on clinical application. Through class work and supervision, participants will be helped to develop their understanding of patients, their capacity for effective therapeutic communication, and their ability for use of self in the treatment setting.

Each student will work with two patients in weekly psychotherapy. Students may be assigned patients from the institute's clinic and be paid on a fee-per-session basis. Upon approval of their supervisors, students may opt instead to work with patients from private practice or work settings.

Every student will participate in one group and one individual supervision session weekly with a program supervisor. Students are expected to be in psychoanalytic psychotherapy at least once weekly, starting with their first semester.

Graduates are eligible to apply to the four year analytic program. If accepted, they may receive credit and start in the second year of the four year program.

In addition to the formal program, students learn by participating in the environment of a vital institute. ICP provides a lecture series, trauma and sexuality workshops and the opportunity to be part of a professional community.

- The manifestation of gender, race, culture, class, and language in the therapeutic dyad
- The role of enactments and their contribution to the articulation of transference/countertransference phenomena
- Clinical processes throughout the life span
- Informed psychoanalytic practice in less conventional settings
- The contribution of group, family, or couples' therapy to psychoanalytic understanding
- Applied psychoanalysis as it illuminates today's politics and economics

- Cover sheet with (a) name, address, phone number, fax number, and e-mail; (b) title of paper; (c) one-paragraph abstract summarizing core ideas of paper; and (d) two educational objectives that state what you intend the audience to learn
- A brief one-paragraph professional biographical statement that lists your credentials, education, two to three affiliations, two to three publications, geographical area of practice, and so on
- A copy of the full paper with no biographical or identifying data. Presentations will be approximately 25–40 minutes each.
